Read the Following Verses:

Ezekiel 17:1-10

Speak a **parable** to the house of Israel; say, Thus says the Lord God: A great eagle with great wings and long pinions, rich in plumage of many colors, came to Lebanon and took the top of the cedar...

Hebrews 9:1-10

By this the Holy Spirit indicates that the way into the holy places is not yet opened as long as the first section is still standing (which is **symbolic** for the present age).

Matthew 13:10-11

“Why do you speak to them in **parables**?” He answered them, “To you it has been given to know the secrets of the kingdom of heaven, but to them it has not been given.

### Important things to remember about parables:

1

A parable is a simple word picture (analogy) teaching a spiritual lesson.

Q

*Why use a parable instead of just saying it plainly?*

2

Every parable has one (often ONLY one) main idea that it is teaching.

*What is the main idea in today's parable?*

3

A parable's purpose is to hide truth to some and reveal truth to others. (See *Matthew 13:10-11*)

Q

*Why would Jesus want to hide truth?  
(See also Prov. 25:2)*

4

Characters and items in a parable should not be allegorized more than the intention of the author.

Why does Jesus quote Isaiah 6? What can we learn about this parable from that passage?

4

In the Old Testament *mä·shäl'* (*parables*) are mostly used by prophets. Do you think there is any important connection with the prophets who spoke parables and Jesus?

5

Jesus doesn't talk about the farmer tilling the soil (This is NOT the main idea). Tilling usually took place before or just after scattering the seeds. What are some ways we can till our own ground? What are some ways we can till the soil of others?

6

Read through John 15 and discuss the importance of staying connected to Jesus in order to produce fruit. How do we stay connected to him?

**I**NTRODUCTION

How can we grow in our relationship with Jesus? We can grow by following the letters of GROW.

**1**

**Groundwork (break up the ground).**

*How will you go about breaking up the hard ground that may be in your heart?*

**2**

**Rays and rain (good and bad, both are needed).**

*Can you think of trials and tribulation that have helped you mature in Christ?*

**3**

**Oppose erosion.**

*What are the ways you can oppose erosion?*

**4**

**Weed the weeds.**

*What weeds need to be removed from your heart? How will you go about removing them?*

**C**HALLENGE

Be the soil that the Gospel grows in. Go out with confidence that the seeds you plant will find its way onto good ground. Help those who are like soil 2 and 3 to become like soil 4.
